Students are not officially inhdrawn from the University until completion of an exit interview with the Office of Student Development. The date of the exterior is the official date of withdrawal.

Tuiion Refund Policy

Tuition charges are refunded according to the following dule: The refund calculation will be based upon the dat in which the student submits appriate withdrawal paperwork:

One week or less:

Two weeks or less:

80% refund
Three weeks or less:

60% refund
Four weeks or less:

40% refund
Five weeks or less:

20% refund
More than five weeks:

no refund

Room and Board Refunds

Students who withdraw from the University in the semester must move contuniversity housing within 48 hours following the exit interview. If leaving at the endto semester, the normalosing schedule is followed. Exceptions must be approved by the Defactudents Office. Before leiang campus, students must check out of their room or rental property with the appropriate staff member (ARCAO and/or someone in the Student Development Office). Upon checking out students must ituthe appropriate papeout along with the key.

For students withdrawing on a voluntary basis, housing and board refunding the stated on a pro-ted basis through the 5th week and are based on the date exit interview and proper checkst. After the 5th week, no refund is granted.

Financial Aid

Students who withdraw prior to the firestay of classes have all of their financial returned. Sturents who withdraw during the first five weeks of the semester have patheoif financial aid returned to the appropriate agencies:

Wittenberg and State financial aid is returned at the samentage rate as tuition is funded; for example, if a student receives a 20% refund of tuition, 20% institutional aid will be returned to the institutional funds and Ohio state aid will be returned to the Ohio Board of Regents.

- Federal financial aid, including parent and student loan, is earned on a perlobisins. For example, if there are 100 days in a semester, each day attended allows to keep 1% of the federal aid total for that semester.
- Federal financial aid that is to be returned is credited first towards student loans, then towards parent lo
 and finally towards grant programs. For example, student receives \$1000 in loans and \$500 in grants a
 we are required to return \$900, flow \$900 is credited towards the loan.e. the student would withdraw
 with a \$100 loan and a \$500 grant.

For students who withdraw after thest five weeks of the semester not the hours or State financial aid is returned.

• Federal financial aid is still returned or diem basis – see above. It is plots for a student to withdraw and owe more money to the University this they were to finish the semester.
